

Responsibilities of Organising Country and Host Nation

Organising Country

- (a) Official Welcome during the opening ceremony
- (b) Entry List and Insurance coordination (with Commodore, Insurance Manager and PRC)
- (c) Establish Prizes (10 per fleet stating name of the competition, group and result)
- (d) Find Sponsors for the event. Verify possible deals with the commodore before signing any contract with agents or sponsors.
- (e) Organize Give aways
- (f) Hand out the prizes at the prize giving ceremony together with the PRC and Commodore

Host Nation

- (a) Close cooperation and exchange of information with the European Commodore and the PRC
- (b) Find suitable ice for up to 200 entries with sufficient parking, motor home facilities, toilets and electricity at the launch site and access to the ice.
- (c) Identify Accommodation in the area for up to 200 entries and inform all National Secretaries of the possibilities via the web site.
- (e) Provide Accommodation in the Race HQ for the PRC/12 beds for the PRC (2,3 or 4 bed rooms are acceptable) and half board.
- (f) Security arrangements.
- (g) Provision of snow clearing equipment in the parking area.
- (h) Establish contact with:
 - 1. Local authorities in the area and get permission for the event.
 - 2. Local people in evaluating the ice (skaters, ice boaters and fishermen.
 - 3. Local rescue organisations and identify actions to be taken and telephone numbers to be used in the event of an accident. Ensure that these actions and telephone numbers are known by the PRC and posted on the Notice Board.
 - 4. The local mayor and press – if considered helpful.
 - 5. A local entrepreneur to provide hot drinks and snacks on the shore or preferably the ice if no sponsor is involved in supplying food.
- (i) Identify local sightseeing possibilities for families and friends of Participants.

When the Regatta takes place in the planned country (No Move) all The above responsibilities are those of the Organising country.
